


Important entry notes for competitors – please read carefully

A maximum of 3 entry tickets per horse will be allocated. Additional tickets can be purchased upon submitting your entries. If you are a member you will receive an additional member ticket.

One horsebox pass will be allocated per entry form. If you require extra horsebox passes or competitor car passes, please specify this on your entry form.

Prizes

All prize winners will be awarded a prize voucher by the Steward. This can be either cashed on the day at The Bank (adjacent to the Show Office) or sent to the show office in Bramley for a BACS transfer. Please ensure your account details are written clearly on the voucher. Vouchers must be redeemed by 31st July 2019.

General rules and regulations

These rules apply equally to competitors and exhibitors, to owners and/or those responsible for a competitor or exhibitor.

1. Where relevant, all owners and riders should be a member of their respective breed or showing Society. Horse and pony classes will be judged according to their respective Society, Association or discipline rules.

2. Stallions must be wearing a bridle disc and/or tail ribbons to clearly identify them as a stallion at all times. No member shall allow a stallion for which he/she is responsible as owner, lessee, authorized agent or ride to compete or be prepared to compete in any competition without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.
3. Refunds are not permitted unless a veterinary certificate can be provided showing proof of injury or illness for the animal entered. In this instance, refunds will be given for the entry fee minus the RIHS levy of £9.50. No refunds of entry loss will be made if the show has to be cancelled for any reason beyond the control of the Society.
4. The Society reserves the right to cancel any breed/type section with three or less exhibitors, and to amalgamate or cancel classes where necessary. In the event of a class having to be cancelled, the entry fees will be returned minus the RIHS levy.
5. Any competitor intending to object to any exhibit must notify the Show Secretary in writing within one hour of the class having been judged with a deposit of £25.00, which will be returned if the protest is sustained, but if in the opinion of the Executive Committee the objection is unreasonable, the deposit will be forfeited. The decision of the Executive Committee shall be final and binding to all parties.
6. Riders ages will be taken as on the date of the show, except where stated otherwise. In classes run under NPS Rules the ages of riders and handlers are all taken as at 1st January of the current year.
7. Please specify where possible whether you/your horse can be categorized as; novice, amateur, home produced or young rider.
8. A judge's decision shall be final.
9. Neither the Society nor any of its officers or servants will be responsible for anything that may happen to exhibitors, their servants or any other person, or their respective property or animals, or to any exhibit at the show, and it shall be considered a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and that he shall be considered to indemnify the Society against any legal proceedings, claims or demands

in respect thereof.

10. Exhibitors acknowledge that they are taking part in a risk sport and agree to having achieved a level of competency. In addition, they agree that they understand it is their responsibility to insure their property, animals and livestock whilst on the Showground and hold full public liability insurance.
11. The use of doping substances and controlled medication substances in equines competing at the Show will not be tolerated. Competitors should refer to the equine anti-doping and controlled medication rules issued by their governing body or society. Equine anti-doping and controlled medication testing may be carried out at the Show.
12. If any member, competitor or exhibitor violates any of the rules or regulations, they will forfeit any prize or prizes to which they may be entitled and, if a member, be subjected to expulsion from the Society.
13. Any dispute or doubt arising on any questions connected with the Society shall be referred to the Show Secretary in the first instance, who may refer the matter to the Society's Chairman of Council or Chairman of the Horse Committee as appropriate.
14. Pregnant equines where 90% or more of the gestation period has elapsed may not be transported to the show.
15. In classes where there is a height restriction, entries may be measured on the ground, unless an Official Measurement Certificate is produced.
16. All those entering the rings with equines must be properly dressed i.e. wearing suitable hats, jackets and their exhibit number where applicable.
17. Anyone riding an equine on the showground must wear a hat of a standard approved by the governing body of their respective breed society, association or discipline and under whose rules they are exhibiting and competing.
18. All equines should be accompanied by their approved DEFRA passport and will have received either a primary course or booster vaccination for equine influenza within the last six months.

19. No animals, other than that named and described in the catalogue can be exhibited at the Show, and substitutions can only be taken up to Wednesday 22nd May 2019, with notification in writing to the Show Office. This is with exception of the show jumping classes where special rules apply.
20. The Society reserves the right to alter the timetable of classes publicised at short notice if deemed necessary.
21. The Surrey County Agricultural Society shall have power to interpret these rules and the regulations above mentioned if there should be any ambiguity or difference of opinion concerning the purport or intention of any rule or regulation. The Society shall have power to deal with any matter not provided for in these rules. A full copy of the articles of association of the society may be obtained from the secretary on request.
22. The Surrey County Agricultural Society has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present at the show. Animals, however, can sometimes be unpredictable. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid or prevent accidents occurring and must act upon the instructions of officials and stewards.

Privacy. Surrey County Agricultural Society will require you to provide certain personal information. We will store this information in an encrypted database and use it to notify you of future events and membership renewals. Your name will also be published in the Show Guide for the Surrey County Show and personal details will be passed on to your relevant Breed Society to notify them of results. Should you not wish us to use your information in this way, please email secretary@surreycountyshow.co.uk stating exactly which element(s) you wish to opt out of.

Qualifiers: BHS Royal International Horse Show (RIHS) qualifiers
(£9.50 levy per entry applies)

SHB (GB) rules: Classes 2 - 4 are qualifiers for the 2019 RIHS and only horses registered on the Show Hunter Register are eligible to enter. Registration numbers must be quoted on entry forms and owners and riders must be members of the Society. The two highest placed horses in each class will qualify to enter at the RIHS. No horse lower than second in its class will qualify. It is strongly recommended that competitors aged 18 or over wear correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current safety standards: All PAS015, VG1, (BS) EN 1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 38382003 onwards and it is mandatory for competitors under the age of 18 to wear such skull caps or hats.

Day Ticket = £36 (this entitles competitors to compete at a maximum of 2 show's in the year at £36 per show – it covers owner and rider membership together with horse registration for that show). If the class is a qualifying class for RIHS, in order for the qualification to be valid, application for full owner/rider membership and horse registration must be received in the SHB(GB) office within 14 days.

Competitors qualifying at this show for the BHS Royal International Horse Show 23 - 28 July 2019 must submit their entries online within 48 hours of qualifying <http://www.hickstead.co.uk/entries-and-results/longines-fei-jumping-nations-cup-of-great-britain-at-the-royal-international-horse-show/>
Classes: 2 - 4 (Ridden hunters).

BSHA rules: Horses must be registered with the Association and all Owners,

Exhibitors and Riders must be Association Members. Riders must be 15 years of age or older. Registration numbers must be quoted on the entry form. Classes 5 - 7 are qualifiers for the Royal International Horse Show. The first prize winner will qualify to compete at the final. If already qualified the second will qualify. If the first and second are already qualified then the third will go forward. The three highest placed prize winners in each Open Affiliated class will qualify to compete in the BSHA Classic Supreme classes at the National Championship Show September 2019. The BSHA offer a Novice, Young Rider and Amateur rosette in each Open class and a Champion rosette for each section. The Association will also award an Amateur Home Produced rosette in each Open Cob (Lightweight and Heavyweight) class. These rosettes have been kindly sponsored by TSG, Mr L Turley. The awards will go down the line and there is no limit to how many of these rosettes can be claimed in a year.

Classes: 5 - 7 (Ridden cobs)

BPSA rules: These classes are affiliated to the BSPA and are qualifiers for the RIHS, Tuesday 23rd July 2019. Classes will be judged under BSPA rules (www.bsponline.com). All horses/ponies must be registered and all owners and riders BSPA members prior to the Show. Rider age is taken from 1st January. Membership and qualification cards must be carried in the ring by competitors and produced as required for inspection or signature. Failure to do so will mean disqualification. Spurs may not be worn in any pony classes. Ponies 153cm or under (Shetlands exempt) must possess a current JMB height certificate. Competitors qualifying at this show for the Royal International Horse Show 23rd – 28th July 2019 must submit their entries by recorded delivery post with full payment within 48 hours of qualifying to The Showing Secretary, All England Jumping Course, Hickstead, West Sussex, RH17 5NU. Schedules and entry forms can be downloaded at www.hickstead.co.uk. All stallions must be graded and licensed by BSPA and have a BSPA stallion ID card and wear a BSPA stallion ID disc. No rider under 14 may exhibit a stallion in any class. No competitor/owner/horse may compete in this class or enter the ring without current 2019 membership of BSPA and a RIHS qualification card. Memberships/horse registrations must be in place before you enter classes. 1st place and the next unqualified competitor standing 2nd or 3rd qualify from each class. No competitor may qualify from lower than 3rd place. The highest placed amateur and highest placed junior

in each class qualify for Amateur and Junior Supreme Championship Finals to be held at BSPA World of Colour Championship Show 2019 at the College EC, Keysoe, Bedfordshire. Cards to be shown and qualification card signed. All Champion and Reserve Champion winners qualify for the BSPA Star Championships at the World of Colour Championships. Failure to comply with these rules will mean disqualification.

Classes: 9 - 12 (Ridden skewbald and piebald).

Other qualifiers

Blue Chip and Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) £2,000 Challenge. The highest placed horse (not already qualified) from each of the following classes 1 - 4 (hunters) and 5 - 7 (cobs) that is registered or eligible for registration on the Irish Draught or Irish Draught Sport Horse Registers, i.e. with a minimum of 25% proven Irish Draught breeding, will qualify for the Final of the Blue Chip & IDHS(GB) £2000 challenge. Horses need not be registered with the Irish Draught Horse Society (GB) to qualify but must be on the IDHS (GB) Registers by the time of the Championship which will be held at the IDHS (GB) Annual Breed Show on 17th - 18th August 2019 AT Arena UK, Allington, Grantham, Lincolnshire, NG32 2EF. NB: A horse may only qualify for the Final once, regardless of the type or number of classes won, placed in or entered. Each qualifier will receive a card and a £10 voucher from Blue Chip. Qualifiers are required to complete an online form at www.idhsgb.com to inform the IDHS (GB) that they have qualified for the Final. In the Final, the Champion will be awarded £1,000 prize money, a trophy and a Blue Chip rug. The Reserve Champion will be awarded £500 and 3rd to 7th inclusive will be awarded £100 each. In addition, the highest placed Pure Bred Irish Draught will receive a trophy and £100, the highest placed 158cm (15.2hh) and under will receive a trophy and £50, the highest placed Sport Horse will receive a trophy and £50 and the highest placed Amateur Produced and Ridden Horse will receive £50, a silver salver and a rug.

Classes: 1 - 4 (Ridden hunters), 5 - 7 (Ridden cobs).

World Championship of Colour 2019. BSPA classes are open to skewbald and piebald horses and ponies only. Open to members and non members. These classes are affiliated to the British Skewbald and Piebald Association and are qualifiers for the World Championships of Colour National Championship Show. All classes will be judged within the rules and criteria of the BSPA.

Copies of the rulebook and membership/horse registration/overstamping forms can be obtained from the show office (01354 638226) or downloaded from www.bspaonline.com. All stallions 4 years and over must be graded, licensed and registered with BSPA in order to compete, must carry into the ring their BSPA showing ID card and must wear their 2019 BSPA bridle disc. In order to qualify all owners, handlers and riders must be members of the BSPA and all horses/ponies registered with the BSPA prior to the show. BSPA qualification cards must be produced in the ring and be signed by the judge, otherwise qualification is invalid. The highest placed amateur and highest placed junior in each class qualify for amateur and junior Supreme Championship finals to be held at BSPA World of Colour Championship Show in September 2019, The College EC, Keysoe, Bedfordshire. Amateur and junior cards must be shown and the qualification card signed. Qualifications 1st to 3rd in all classes, or 1st to 4th for classes exceeding 10 forward. *Classes: 13 - 14 (in-hand skewbald and piebald).*

The 1st, 2nd and 3rd placed competitors will qualify for the Gold Medal

Series at the Ponies (UK) Summer Classic 2019, Equifest 2019 and BSPA 2019. No membership is required to enter or compete in any Championship Final.

NPS Qualifying Rounds. These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible for Mountain and Moorland Classes. Qualifying rounds are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members but only ponies owned by adult NPS Qualifying or Life members are eligible to qualify for the final of the competition at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 6th - 8th August 2019. The highest placed pony, if owned by an NPS member, in each class will qualify for the final. Qualification may pass down to third place if the first and second ponies are already qualified.

Classes 18 - 19 (M & M open ridden) and 27 - 36 (M & M in-hand).

NPS Silver Medal Rosette Championships. These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. NPS Silver Medal Rosettes are only awarded when the owner of the champion pony is a Qualifying or Life member of the NPS. A valid membership card must be in the rider's/handler's possession on entering the ring and be produced immediately on request by either the judge or the steward. If the owner of the Champion pony is not a member, or the owner's membership card is not immediately produced, the rosette may be awarded to the Reserve Champion provided they have the required membership card. If the Champion pony has previously qualified it is still entitled to the Silver Medal Rosette but the qualification card goes to the Reserve Champion pony, provided the owner of that pony is a member of the NPS. The Silver Medal Rosette and the qualification card can be awarded no lower than first Reserve (third). Foals are not eligible for Silver Medal Championships. Qualifiers are entitled to compete in the final of the Silver Medal Rosette Championship to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show 6th - 8th August 2019.

Classes 18 - 19 (M & M open ridden), 27 - 36 (M & M in-hand).

The RoR Tattersall's Thoroughbred Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2019. The first THREE go forward to the championship at the Hickstead Derby Meeting on 23rd June 2019. All entries MUST be registered with the RoR and include their current competition registration number on entry form and have raced in GB. All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be

bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force'. Please be aware that the show will split the class on the horse's last run in a race (NH or Flat) or will provide 2 ride judges should the entries exceed 20. Please mark your entry form accordingly. Competitors must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap. Racing injuries and blemishes will NOT be ignored in this series

Veteran Horse Society – Area Qualifier 2019. First round qualifier for the Veteran Horse Society Supreme Final: VETERAN HORSE OF THE YEAR 2019. Kindly sponsored by Allen & Page.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to the VHS rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final Qualification. All competitors placed 1st - 4th in each Area Qualifier class will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their card in the ring at all times and have their showing card signed by the judge as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. It is the competitors responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge. Regional finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, 27th - 29th September 2019, Arena UK, Lincolnshire. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS web site for schedule.

TSR Showing Finals. This show is a qualifier for the 2019 TSR Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the finals - Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales and South West or Scottish. You do not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of finals.

TSR Rider Finals: 1st and 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification card in the ring.

TSR In-hand Finals: The two highest placed handlers with a TSR in-hand card

will qualify in any in-hand class. Handlers **MUST** have their cards signed in the ring by the judge/steward. Cards are available **FREE** from the TSR website. Full details at www.theshowingregister.co.uk.

TSR Medal Awards. TSR members can collect qualification cards and signatures and redeem for a TSR Medal. See TSR website for details.

Classes: 1 - 37 (all).

National Welsh Brightwells Section A, B, C and D In-Hand Championships.

Held at the National Welsh Championship Show at the Three Counties Showground, Malvern on the 4th August 2019. Both the champion and reserve champion Sections A, B, C and D will qualify for this Championship. In the event of either having previously qualified, then the qualification will pass to the 2nd reserve in the Championship. These are also qualifying classes for the National Welsh Sarum Investment Gelding Championship. Qualifying cards will go to the highest placed gelding in each class.

Classes 31 and 34 (Welsh in-hand).

The National Welsh Brynseion Stud Ridden Section A, B, C & D

Championships. To be held at the National Welsh Championship Show at the Three Counties Showground, Malvern on the 4th August 2019. The two highest placed ridden Welsh Section A, B, C and D ponies will qualify for this Championship. If either pony has previously qualified, then it can be awarded to the next eligible pony.

Classes 18 - 19 (M & M open ridden).

Exmoor Pony of The Year. The Exmoor Pony Society will award two pony of the year qualifiers - one to the highest placed adult and one to the highest placed gelding. Owner to be members of the Exmoor Pony Society.

Class 29 (Exmoor in-hand).

The Tam O'Shanter Breeding Championships. Held at the British Connemara Pony Society (BCPS) Annual Breed Show on Saturday 13th July 2019 at Vale View Equestrian Centre, Nottingham Lane, Old Dalby, Melton Mowbray, LE14 3LX. Qualifying cards will be awarded to the three highest placed yearlings, two-year-olds and three-year-olds, any sex, plus to the three highest placed 4 years old and over mares.



Donkeys

Donkey rules and regulations

1. No person may deliberately enter or show a donkey under a judge who is known to have either owned, bred, leased, sold, produced or prepared that donkey. No donkey should be entered or shown under a judge who has owned, bred or leased the sire of that animal. The breeder is the mare's owner.
2. Entering one donkey and exhibiting another is not permitted. Once judging has commenced, a donkey may or may not be led or ridden in or out of the ring without the permission of the judge.
3. No nomination entries are permitted.
4. DBS members must carry their DBS membership cards at all times when showing for production on request in order to receive DBS rosettes.
5. A judge will ask a competitor to leave the ring if either they or their donkey act in an improper manner.
6. Stallions and entire colts must be properly dressed in bridle and bit with the leading rein correctly attached to the bit. No person under the age of 17 may handle an entire donkey (foals excepted). No entire male donkey is allowed to compete in any children's classes.

7. Ridden classes: Donkeys entered must be four years old and over and must have a correctly fitting bridle and saddle. A child of 8 years and under may compete on a leading rein in any riding class. When a child competes on a leading rein, the donkey must be led by a competent adult (18yrs and over) and leading reins must be attached to the noseband. All riders must wear an approved correctly fitting hard hat to conform to the current BSI standards.
8. Young handler classes: To be judged on the ability of the Young Handler and not on the conformation of the donkey. A Young Handler is one who has not attained their 16th birthday on the day of the Show.
9. Championships: The 1st and 2nd prize winners from each class to parade in the ring wearing the appropriate rosettes they have already won.
10. Classes will start at 1pm.

Exhibitors will be supplied with a green vehicle pass. No one may enter the showground without an admission pass. Please display the vehicle pass in your windscreen.
